# Stop Motion A guided tour of past and present

Stop motion:

 an animation technique which makes a physically manipulated object appear to move.

#### Claymation:

- It is the form where each animated piece (character or badkground) is a malleable substance, usually plasticine clay.
- trademarked by Will Vinton

### **Object animation:**

 a form of stop motion animation that involves the animated movements of any non-drawn objects such as toys, blocks, dolls, etc. which are not fully malleable, such as clay or wax, and not designed to look like a recognizable human or animal character.

#### Time lapse animation:

- Possibly the most passive form of stop motion, in which a camera is clicked (either manually or via an intermittent control device called an intervalometer) to take a frame as each period of time elapses, as natural objects of nature and humankind move of their own accord, without the assistance of an animator.
- Often seen in moving clouds, the speeding up of the growth of plants.

#### Cutout animation:

• Use of cutout paper/other materials, manipulated by hand, shot frame by frame.

## Ladyslaw Starewicz

 great Russian stop motion pioneer (1892-1965) who animated The Beautiful Lukanida (1910), The Ant and the Grasshopper (1911), In the Land of Vampires (1935) and the feature film The Tale of the Fox (1937), but a few of his over fifty animated films.

- first filmmaker to use stop motion and puppets to tell coherent stories.
- began by producing insect documentaries, which led to experiments with stop motion animation of insects (he wired the legs to the insects bodies)
- later created leather and felt-covered puppets and eventually advanced ball and socket armatures.

## Jan Svankmajer

- Czech surrealist artist (born 1934)
- gained a reputation over several decades for his ability to make surreal, nightmarish and yet funny, films.
- Trademarks include exaggerated sounds, sped up sequences when people walk and interact, inanimate objects coming alive and using food as a favourite medium for animation.

Film: A game with stones (1965)

### Jiri Barta

- Born in 1948, he continued the aesthetic tradition of puppet film
- often used wood for animation
- worked in the studio founded by another pioneer, Jiri Trinka.

Film: The Pied Piper of Hamelin (1985)

## Willis O'Brien

- Pioneer of American Stop Motion (1886 1963).
- Animated his early creations by covering wooden armatures with clay, later perfecting ball & socket armatures covered with foam, hair and fur.
- Best known for animation on original KING KONG (1933), his 1916 film Nippy's Nightmare was the first to combine live actors with stop motion characters.
- Has inspired generations of film greats such as Ray Harryhausen, George Lucas, Peter Jackson, Tim Burton and Steven Speilberg.

# Ray Harryhausen

- American Film producer, special effects creator
- almost single handedly kept technique alive for three decades.
- film: The Beast from 20,000 Fathoms, first used a technique that split the background and foreground of pre-shot live action footage into two separate pieces of film.
- created the effect that the animated model was "sandwiched" between two live action elements later called it DynaMation.
- Monsters Inc. (2001) restaurant called "Harryhausen's"
